10:00-11:00 Kim Cool - Who Will Buy Your Book?

Anyone can write a book but fewer than 5 percent will see any return on their investment of time and money.

Kim Cool, Features Editor, Venice Gondolier, learned the secrets from the third-largest craft book publisher where she and her business partner created books that sold thousands of copies at the big chain craft stores as well as in giant mail order catalogs. Printings topped 100,000 per title and sold in such numbers that resellers required extra discounts. Successful creators of fiction and non-fiction do the same. Kim shares the not-so-secret pathway to success.

In his own words: "A human being is a complex piece of work. So, creating one for a novel is the key to whether a story works or just falls flat on its creative face. With a few little tricks, coming up with complex, many faceted characters is relatively easy and fun. The 10th annual Venice Book Fair will commence on Saturday March 26 from 9:00 AM 3:00 PM in Blalock Park. We have 40 tents registered for this event. We have room for more authors but need to commit to the number of tents we want early next week. Anyone interested in registering must do so very soon. At this point the tent cost is \$175. A 10x10 foot tent will be provided and may be used by one or two authors. Each tent will include an 8-foot table and two folding chairs. Authors will provide their own table covering and booth identification. Blalock Park has ample parking. As in the past, we plan to have students available to help move books to and from the tents.

We have added the following amenities to the 2022 book fair:

- 3x6 foot banners announcing the Book Fair will be hung in two places entering Venice Island.
- Signage on adjacent streets will be placed to help patrons find their way to the Book Fair.
- Flyers announcing the Book Fair will be distributed to mobile home parks, assisted living facilities, churches, etc.
- The event will be announced in local newspapers and included on the Venice Heritage calendar.

- 3 food trucks serving a variety of burgers, salads, ice cream, pizza, pretzels and cold drinks will be on the premises.
- An area with picnic tables will be available for patrons to enjoy lunch.
- Portable restrooms will be available on site for your convenience.

Mission Statement: To present a sustainable cultural event in Venice, with the net proceeds going to Venice Heritage Inc.

Tips for authors participating in the 2022 Venice Book Fair

<u>Tents</u> The 10 x 10-foot tents, including an 8- foot table and two folding chairs, will be in place when authors arrive. All you need to bring are your books and banners or other promotional materials to make your booth stand out.

Please see Page 8-9 for your tent number assignment. Site map is on pg 10.

An unloading area will be designated on Nassau Street, next to the west side of the park. Again, the high school students will be available to help you get your books from your car to the tent.

Authors should be set up by 8:30 a.m.

Portable restrooms will be available on the grounds.

Food Food trucks will be available on the premises with sandwiches, salads, pizza, pretzels, ice cream and drinks. Menus can be found on pgs 11-12.

<u>Breakdown</u> Breakdown is at 3 p.m. Please do not leave sooner as a courtesy to the other vendors. High school students will be available to help take any books you have left at the end of the day to your car in the drop-off area on Nassau Street. Authors should bring carts on wheels to help get your books to your site.

<u>Banners</u> The best way to attach your banner to the tent is by running string through the holes at the top of the banner and tying the banner around the post at the top of the tent. Many people have tablecloths that serve as banners as well.

<u>Posters</u> You'll want to attach your poster to your easel securely, otherwise you'll be battling the wind all day. Stick-on picture hangers on the back of posters or bungy cords are good ways to secure posters to easels.

<u>Parking</u> Parking is available in the parking lot on the south side of the Venice Community Center. After unloading your vehicle, please move it to the parking lot. You will have to walk across the street to the park. It is not far.

<u>Promotions</u> Feel free to write a 20 second blurb describing you and/or your book. During the morning, someone will collect your 20- second announcement about your tent or books. These blurbs will be announced by our MC throughout the event. If you are offering a special, a hot-off-the-press release, or other attention-getting item, you will want to emphasize it in your one- or two-sentence blurb. Be sure to mention your tent number.

<u>Rain</u> In the event of inclement weather, you will want to have a tarp, plastic or other protection. It's advisable to have a plastic bin for your books and other items.


Your tents have tops that will protect you from the sun, but not sides. You'll have to move quickly to salvage your books if a rain- storm comes up. You'll want to have light rain gear for yourself, as well – just in case. There is no rain date, so the show must go on.

<u>Pets</u> If you choose to bring a pet, please make sure it has a kennel for shade and security, as there will be many people -- both big and small -- and other people's pets passing through. Such activity can get a little stressful for some animals so they need a safe place to get away from the crowd. It is usually hot so you need to be sure your pet has water, snacks and something to cover the kennel to provide shade or provide protection in the event of rain.
